PIN. ANNIVERSARY AUCTION - For the love of art

PIN. Friends of the Pinakothek der Moderne's charity auction held on November 19 marks the culmination of 20 years of passionate commitment for the Pinakothek der Moderne, which opened 20 years ago, as well as for the Museum Brandhorst. Top lots by stars of the international art scene such as Cecily Brown, Katharina Grosse, André Butzer or Pipilotti Rist, but also by exciting young talents, give reason to hope for an auction result that will enable the association to continue its indispensable support of museums in the coming year. Commenting on the top-class selection of lots, Robert Ketterer says: "The range promises high quality and great variety. It is inspiring what consignments PIN. is able to generate every year. Art enthusiasts should take advantage of the preview to see for themselves."

"For the love of art" is therefore our motto this year. Thanks to PIN., 20 million euros were handed over to the museums over the past two decades, 20 million that have been used for groundbreaking acquisitions, ambitious exhibitions and innovative outreach projects at the Pinakothek der Moderne and the Museum Brandhorst. This enormous sum has played a decisive role in determining Munich's cultural standing and has given the museums planning security even during the pandemic - in contrast to budget cuts by the state.

The commitment has paid off. During the anniversary week, which took place in mid-September, the visitors, who came in their thousands after the quiet pandemic months, were carried away by an extremely varied, multi-layered program. The focus was on the anniversary show MIX & MATCH, which was 50% financed by PIN. As a presentation spanning genres and epochs, MIX & MATCH follows both the interdisciplinary founding idea of the Pinakothek der Moderne and the awareness of diversity and change in our immediate present. In doing so, it addresses topics of increasing relevance to 21st century society - topics such as social cohesion, migration movements, new forms of work, or environmental issues.

"More than ever, all of our efforts are needed," emphasizes Dorothée Wahl, chair of the Friends. "There is no other place that can contribute so effectively to social cohesion and exchange across generations as the museum."

Robert Ketterer also sees it this way: "Art gives joy and inspiration. It can also generate thoughtfulness and heighten awareness of social issues. If we allow it, art promotes the individual development of each person and thus also the progress of our society."

The Pinakothek der Moderne and the Museum Brandhorst form a cultural cosmos that encompasses essential forms of contemporary expression with its independent collections of art, graphics, architecture and design. For 2023, PIN. has already pledged support for numerous projects, including major exhibitions on artists Max Beckmann, Tony Cragg and Nicole Eisenman. Design is represented by a large, space-related installation by Paula Sher, and another exhibition is dedicated to the theme "Kranke(n)häuser - wie Architektur heilen hilft" (Hospitals - How Architecture Helps to Heal). Flanked by numerous educational projects for all age groups, the projects funded by PIN. will continue to be cultural beacons in the coming year. How strongly they shine depends not least on the success of the PIN. Benefit Auction.
